


FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

During these lovely days of Christmas we continue our beautiful reflection of the Fathers of the Church on the joyous mysteries we celebrate. We began a new year of grace with the Solemnity of the Mother of God and World Day of Peace (Jan. 1) and then we have the next two Sundays to continue reflecting on the infancy of Our Lord. Since love underlies all the mysteries of Jesus it is very fruitful to contemplate them with faith, with reverence, but above all with love. In this way we may better profit from the Church's liturgical celebrations prepared for our spiritual edification and advancement on our way to eternal life.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany – a word from the Greek ἐπιφάνεια (*epiphaneia*) which derives from the verb “to appear” and means “manifestation,” “appearance.” In classical Greek it was used for the appearance of dawn, of an enemy in war, but especially for the manifestation of a deity to a worshipper (a theophany). Christians fixed the date of the feast on January 6 quite early in their history. The earliest reference to the Epiphany as a Christian feast was in A.D. 361.

Here are some excerpts from an Epiphany homily given by Pope St. Leo the Great (*Sermo* 37):

1)- The humility of Christ: “When the brightness of a new star had led three wise men to worship Jesus, they did not see him ruling over demons, not raising the dead, not restoring sight to the blind or mobility to the lame or speech to the dumb, nor in any action of divine power. They saw him, rather, as a Child –silent, at rest, placed in the care of his Mother– in a situation where there appeared no indication of power. From this lowliness, however, a great miracle was presented. Consequently, the mere sight of that Sacred Infancy to which God the Son of God had adapted himself was bringing to their eyes a preaching that would be imparted to their ears. What the sound of his voice was not yet presenting, the activity of sight was teaching them. For the entire victory of the Savior, the one that overcame the devil and the world, began in humility and ended in humility.”

2)- The cross in the life of Christ – present from the first moments of His earthly life: “His appointed time began under persecution and ended under persecution. Neither the endurance of suffering was lacking to the child, nor the gentleness of a child to the one who would suffer... He did not refuse anything that his persecutors brought down on him. In obedience to the Father, he bore the cruelties of violent men with the meekest docility. How humble we ought to be, then, how patient, we who, when we meet with any distress, never undergo anything we do not deserve! *Who will boast that they have a pure heart or that they are clean from sin?* (Prov. 20: 9). St. John says, *If we say we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us.* (1 Jn. 1: 8)”

3)- The above two characteristics of the Jesus' Nativity – His humility and His cross – must also be present in our lives if we want to be authentic disciples of the Lord. “Who will be found so free from guilt that they have not in themselves anything for justice to condemn or mercy to forgive? Consequently, dearly beloved, the whole learning of Christian wisdom consists not in abundance of words, not in cleverness at disputing, not in desire for praise and glory, but in a true and willing humility. This is what the Lord Jesus Christ chose and taught from within the womb of his Mother right up to his torment on the cross: by enduring everything with fortitude. When the disciple, as the Evangelist says, arguing among themselves as to “which one of them would be greater in the kingdom of heaven, [Jesus] called a little child and stood him in their midst and said: *'Amen, I say to you, unless you change yourselves and become like little children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever, therefore, humble themselves like this child will be the greater in the kingdom of heaven.'*”

Brothers and Sisters, may we allow the mystery of Christmas to teach us to prepare our heart to always live according to these greatest principles of our faith.

May God bless you and grant you all the graces during this beautiful time.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind,

“Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Mt 28:20).

There are **168 HOURS** in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going **24/7**, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of **411 PEOPLE**.

*While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. **Don't be afraid** to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.*

January is: Human Trafficking Awareness Month


Human trafficking, modern-day slavery, is defined as “the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for commercial sex, labor or services through the use of force, fraud, or coercion, for the purpose of subjecting that person to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage or slavery.” In the United States any minor under 18 years of age involved in prostitution is considered trafficked.
(Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act of 2000)

“Slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children and disgraceful working conditions, where people are treated as mere instruments of gain...poison human society...and debase the perpetrators.”



"We fail to practice mastery over our attachments when we use them

- in excess of our needs
- for purposes other than that for which they were intended
- as ends rather than as means to a legitimate end.

The most fundamental basis of our spiritual life is the recognition that we are creatures and that God is our Creator. To prefer a creature to the Creator has made us prefer a lesser good. When we cling to a creature we become like that creature. No matter how good that creature may be, it is nevertheless finite. If we are attached to what is finite we will be unable to enter into the transforming union of the infinite – Divine Beauty.

For what has the creature to do with the Creator? What has sensual to do with spiritual? Visible with invisible? Temporal with eternal? Food that is heavenly, spiritual and pure with food that is of sense alone and is purely sensual? Christlike poverty of spirit with attachment to aught soever? (Ascent, Chapter 4, #1)"

**"DUC IN ALTUM!
PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP!"**



Dear parishioners:
On the Epiphany of 2002, our beloved Blessed John Paul II reminded us our call for the new evangelization. He stated:
"I repeat to you the Redeemer's words: Duc in altum! Put out into the deep! Do not be afraid of the darkness of the world, because the one who is calling you is "the light of the world", "the bright morning star". (...) How striking is the symbol of the star that recurs in all the images of Christmas and Epiphany! It still gives rise to deep feelings although, as with so many other sacred signs, it risks becoming common place because of its commercial overuse. Restored to its original context, the star we contemplate over the crib also speaks to the mind and heart of the man of the third millennium. It speaks to secularized man, awakening in him the nostalgia of his condition as pilgrim in search of the truth with a deep desire for the absolute. The etymology of the word "desire" reminds us of the experience of sailors who find their way at night by observing the stars called in Latin the "sidera".
Who does not feel the need for a "star" to guide him on his earthly journey? Individuals and nations both feel the need. To satisfy the universal yearning for salvation, the Lord himself chose a people to be the guiding star for "all the families of the earth" (Gn 12,3). (Blessed John Paul II)






