## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

"The Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' message. Lovingly received day after day by the Church, it is to be preached with dauntless fidelity as 'good news' to the people of every age and culture." (*Evangelium Vitae*, 1)

God willing, in few days, on Saturday, January 25 we will be able to participate as a parish in the 10<sup>th</sup> Walk for Life West Coast protesting abortion, in San Francisco, CA. The first march for life of the West Coast took place on January 22, 2005, since then, the participation of those who believe in the sanctity of life has increased in numbers and in strength with the firm desire that life can be respected and loved in our country from its very beginning until its natural end.

The sanctity of life which we uphold is indeed related with the mystery of Our Lord. "At the dawn of salvation, it is the Birth of a Child which is proclaimed as joyful news: *I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord* (Lk 2:10-11). The source of this 'great joy' is the Birth of the Savior... and this joy is thus seen to be the foundation and fulfillment of joy at every child born into the world (cf. Jn 16:21)." (cf. *Evangelium Vitae*, 1)

Pope Francis in his recent Apostolic Letter *Evangelii Gaudium*, talking about his concern for the vulnerable, clearly states that: "Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us. Nowadays efforts are made to deny them, their human dignity, and to do with them whatever one pleases, taking their lives and passing laws preventing anyone from standing in the way of this. Frequently, as a way of ridiculing the Church's effort to defend their lives, attempts are made to present her position as ideological, obscurantist and conservative. Yet, this defense of unborn life is closely linked to the defense of each and every other human right. It involves the conviction that a human being is always sacred and inviolable, in any situation, at any stage of development. Human beings are ends in themselves and never a means of resolving other problems. Once this conviction disappears, so do solid and lasting foundations for the defense of human rights, which would always be subject to the passing whims of the powers that be. Reason alone is sufficient to recognize the inviolable value of each single human life, but if we also look at the issue from the standpoint of faith, 'every violation of the personal dignity of the human being cries out in vengeance to God and is an offence against the creator of the individual.'

Confronting this reality, the Holy Father clearly manifests that "the Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. I want to be completely honest in this regard. This is not something subject to alleged reforms or 'modernizations'. It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life."

Dear brothers and sisters, the Blood of Christ, while it reveals the grandeur of the Father's love, shows how precious man is in God's eyes and how priceless the value of his life. The Apostle Peter reminds us of this: *You know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your fathers... with the precious Blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot* (1 Pt 1:18-19). Precisely by contemplating the precious Blood of Christ, the sign of his self-giving love (cf. Jn 13:1), we learn to recognize and appreciate the almost divine dignity of every human being and can exclaim with ever renewed and grateful wonder: *How precious must man be in the eyes of the Creator, if he gained so great a Redeemer* (*Exultet* of the Easter Vigil), and if God gave his only Son in order that man should not perish but have eternal life (cf. Jn 3:16)!

As Blessed Pope John Paul II said: "a great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world... Let us... discover anew the humility and the courage to pray and fast so that power from on high will break down the walls of lies and deceit: the walls which conceal from the sight of so many of our brothers and sisters the evil of practices and laws which are hostile to life. May this same power turn their hearts to resolutions and goals inspired by the civilization of life and love."

**The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind,**  
**"Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).**

There are **168 HOURS** in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going **24/7**, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of **411 PEOPLE**.

*While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.*

**Temporary Liturgical Adaptations during the 2014 Flu/Cold Season**


Once more, a particularly virulent strain of flu (H1N1) and other respiratory contagions are manifesting themselves throughout our nation and here at home, including a growing number of deaths in the county. H1N1 seems most adversely to attack children, healthy young people and pregnant women. Because of this, I have been approached by members of the medical community who have requested that we make a number of temporary adaptations to our celebrations of the Eucharist, so as to foster the health of our worshipping communities and also of the wider community.

For this reason, I find it necessary to implement the following steps wherever Mass is celebrated in the Diocese of San Jose:

1. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will not be shared under the form of Consecrated Wine. Concelebrating priests and assisting deacons are to receive the Precious Blood by means of intinction.
2. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will be distributed only into the hands of communicants; during this time, Holy Communion will not be distributed on the tongue.
3. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, people should not hold hands during the recitation or singing of the Lord's Prayer.
4. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, the Sign of Peace should be adapted so as to allow for a greeting that does not involve shaking hands or touching.
5. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, all who administer Holy Communion are to wash their hands with an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution, such as Purell, before and after they administer the Sacrament. This precaution also extends to those who minister to the homebound.
6. These adaptations are to remain in effect throughout the Diocese until conditions allow me to rescind them.

The Director of Public Health has assured me that these precautions are once again necessary so that we can do our part to foster the health and safety of our people. In conjunction with this, when you explain these adapted procedures to your people, please remind them that the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass does not hold for those who are seriously ill, and that it would be especially prudent for anyone who has fever, cough or other such symptoms to remain at home. Please refer to the article, "Liturgy, Cold, and the Flu: Common Sense Practices," which Diana Macalintal has recently circulated throughout the Diocese.

Thank you for your immediate attention to these matters and for undertaking the catechesis that will be necessary to introduce these adaptations to your parishes and other communities as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of January 18/19.

**WHAT WAS THE FIRST ECUMENICAL COUNCIL?**

- **Who called the First Ecumenical Council?**  
The Roman Emperor Constantine the Great with Pope Saint Sylvester I, the 33rd successor of Peter called the First Ecumenical Council.
- **Where and when did this Council take place?**  
This Council took place in the city of Nicaea, located at the South of Constantinople in Asia Minor (see map) in 325 AD.
- **Who were the protagonists at this Council?**  
The Bishop of Alexandria, Saint Athanasius, who defined the consubstantiality of the Son with the Heavenly Father.
- **What was the most important outcome of this Council?**  
The Council Fathers formulated what we know today as **THE NICENE CREED**:



*"We believe in one God the Father all powerful, maker of all things both seen and unseen. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the only-begotten begotten from the Father, that is from the substance [Gr. ousias, Lat. substantia] of the Father, God from God, light from light, true God from true God, begotten [Gr. gennetheta, Lat. natum] not made [Gr. poetheta, Lat. factum]. CONSUBSTANTIAL [Gr. homoousion, Lat. unius substantiae (quod Graeci dicunt homousion)] with the Father, through whom all things came to be, both those in heaven and those in earth; for us humans and for our salvation he came down and became incarnate, became human, suffered and rose up on the third day, went up into the heavens, is coming to*
