FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday, January 28, we will celebrate the feast of Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), who is without doubt, one of the greatest theologians in the history of the Church. I want to encourage all you to know more about this Holy Doctor's life and writings, which have been praised – more than anyone else's – by the Popes. In fact, "the Church has proclaimed the doctrine of Saint Thomas as her own" (Benedict XV). The following quotes from various Popes may be a good way to learn the importance and greatness of his works and therefore be an incentive to become more acquainted with his teachings.

- Pope John XXII about St. Thomas said that he "illumined the Church more than all the other doctors. In his books, one profits more in only one year than in the study of all the others during ones whole life."

- Pope St. Pius V, who declared him a Doctor of The Church, said that he was "the most brilliant light of the Church," and his works are "the most certain rule of Christian doctrine."

- Benedict XIII wrote to the Order of Preachers that they should "pursue with energy your Doctor's works, more brilliant than the sun and written without the shadow of error. These works made the Church illustrious with wonderful erudition, since they march ahead and proceed with unimpeded step, protecting and vindicating by the surest rule of Christian doctrine, the truth of our holy religion."

- Pope Leo XIII dedicated to him a beautiful encyclical letter "on the restoration of Christian philosophy"; there he says: "this is the greatest glory of Thomas, altogether his own and shared with no other Catholic Doctor, that the Fathers of Trent, in order to proceed in an orderly fashion during the conclave, desired to have opened upon the altar together with the Scriptures and the decrees of the Supreme Pontiffs, the Summa of St. Thomas Aquinas whence they could draw counsel, reasons and answers."

- Pope Benedict XV stated that "the eminent commendations of Thomas Aquinas by the Holy See no longer permit a Catholic to doubt that he was divinely raised up that the Church might have a master whose doctrine should be followed in a special way at all times."

- Pope Pius XI in turn said that "indeed, we so approve of the tributes paid to his almost divine brilliance that we believe Thomas should be called not only Angelic but Common or Universal Doctor of the Church... It is no wonder that the Church has made this light her own and has adorned herself with it, and has illustrated her immortal doctrine with it ... It is no wonder that all the popes have vied with one another in exalting him, proposing him, inculcating him, as a model, master, doctor, patron and protector of all schools."

- John Paul II declared: "The Church has been justified in consistently proposing Saint Thomas as a master of thought and a model of the right way to do theology.... The Magisterium has repeatedly acclaimed the merits of Saint Thomas' thought and made him the guide and model for theological studies.... The Magisterium's intention has always been to show how Saint Thomas is an authentic model for all who seek the truth. In his thinking, the demands of reason and the power of faith found the most elevated synthesis ever attained by human thought, for he could defend the radical newness introduced by Revelation without ever demeaning the venture proper to reason."

- Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* explicitly cites the Angelic Doctor nine times.

Noteworthy of mention: St. Thomas Aquinas is the only theologian listed by name *nominatin* in the documents of the Second Vatican Council.

Let us make ours the advice of Pope Pius XI who said *Ite ad Thomam*: "As it was said of old to the Egyptians in time of famine: Go to Joseph, that they might receive from him a supply of wheat to nourish their bodies, so We now say to all who are seeking the truth: Go to Thomas. Go and ask Thomas for the food of sound doctrine, which nourishes souls for eternal life, and which he possesses in rich abundance."

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind,

There are **168 HOURS** in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going **24/7**, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of **411 PEOPLE.**

While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. **Don't be afraid** to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

Temporary Liturgical Adaptations during the 2014 Flu/Cold Season

Once more, a particularly virulent strain of flu (H1N1) and other respiratory contagions are manifesting themselves throughout our nation and here at home, including a growing number of deaths in the county. H1N1 seems most adversely to attack children, healthy young people and pregnant women. Because of this, I have been approached by members of the medical community who have requested that we make a number of temporary adaptations to our celebrations of the Eucharist, so as to foster the health of our worshipping communities and also of the wider community.

For this reason, I find it necessary to implement the following steps wherever Mass is celebrated in the Diocese of San Jose:

- For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will not be shared under the form of Consecrated Wine. Concelebrating 1. priests and assisting deacons are to receive the Precious Blood by means of intinction.
- 2 For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will be distributed only into the hands of communicants; during this time, Holy Communion will not be distributed on the tongue.
- 3
- For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, people should not hold hands during the recitation or singing of the Lord's Prayer. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, the Sign of Peace should be adapted so as to allow for a greeting that does not involve shaking 4. hands or touching. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, all who administer Holy Communion are to wash their hands with an alcohol-based anti-
- 5. bacterial solution, such as Purell, before and after they administer the Sacrament. This precaution also extends to those who minister to the homebound.

6. These adaptations are to remain in effect throughout the Diocese until conditions allow me to rescind them.

The Director of Public Health has assured me that these precautions are once again necessary so that we can do our part to foster the health and safety of our people. In conjunction with this, when you explain these adapted procedures to your people, please remind then that the obliga-tion to participate in Sunday Mass does not hold for those who are seriously ill, and that it would be especially prudent for anyone who has fever, cough or other such symptoms to remain at home. Please refer to the article, "*Liturgy, Cold, and the Flu: Common Sense Practices*," which Diana Macalintal has recently circulated throughout the Diocese.

Thank you for your immediate attention to these matters and for undertaking the catechesis that will be necessary to introduce these adaptations to your parishes and other communities as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of January 18/19.
