FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Come, let us worship the Lord of creation; He enters his holy temple: opening antiphon for today's beautiful feast of The Presentation of the Lord, commemorating Mary and Joseph's obedience to the Law of Moses in offering their first-born son to God in the Temple in Jerusalem and by offering an animal sacrifice to redeem Him. (cf. Lk 2:22-24).

Pope Benedict XVI said: "It is one of the cases in which liturgical time reflects historical time, because today actually marks forty days after the Solemnity of the Birth of the Lord. The theme of Christ the Light, that is a feature of the cycle of the Christmas festivities and culminates in the Solemnity of the Epiphany, is taken up again and extended in today's feast."

For the Eastern Catholic Churches today celebration is one of the 'so called' twelve Great Feasts, and is sometimes called Hyrapante (Υπαπαντή, lit., 'Meeting' in Greek). Other traditional names include Candlemas (on this day priests blessed the beeswax candles used for liturgical use through the coming year); the Feast of the Purification of the Virgin; and the Meeting of the Lord. In some Western liturgical churches, Vespers (or Compline) on the Feast of the Presentation marks the end of the Epiphany season.

In the Latin Rite of the Roman Catholic Church, the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple is the fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary. It was also reflected in the former practice of the "churching of new mothers," forty days after the birth of a child.

The ritual act of Jesus' parents, which takes place in the humble and hidden manner characteristic of the Incarnation of the Son of God, finds a unique welcome in the elderly Simeon and the Prophetess Anna. By divine inspiration they recognize the Baby as the Messiah foretold by the prophets. In the meeting of the elderly Simeon and young mother Mary, the Old and New Testaments converge in a wonderful way in the thanksgiving for the gift of the Light which has shone in the darkness, preventing it from prevailing: Christ the Lord, the light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel (cf. Lk 2:32).

Today the Church also celebrates "World Day of Consecrated Life". Blessed John Paul II, who established this tradition in 1997, set forth its specific goals:

- 1) - It seeks to respond to the need to give praise and thanks to the Lord for the gift of this state of life which belongs to the sanctity of the Church. "Today, the prayer of the entire community is dedicated to every consecrated person, giving thanks to God the Father, giver of every good, for the gift of this vocation, and once again invoking him with faith."
- 2) - This occasion offers the opportunity to appreciate increasingly the testimony of those who have chosen to follow Christ through the practice of the evangelical counsels by promoting understanding and appreciation of the consecrated life within the People of God.
- 3) - World Day for Consecrated Life is meant for all those who have embraced the state of consecrated life in the Church, as "a precious occasion to renew their commitment and rekindle the feelings that inspired and continue to inspire the gift of themselves to the Lord."

Today, let us offer our prayers with special affection for all consecrated men and women throughout the world. I take this opportunity to greet with the utmost gratitude and appreciation my brother priests, and our Sisters who minister at our parish. We also give thanks to God for the priestly and religious vocations arising from our parish and for the generosity of their families. May more young people be ready to accept God's plan for them! Let us entrust all of them to the maternal care of the Blessed Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind, "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are 168 HOURS in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 PEOPLE.

*While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. **Don't be afraid** to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.*

Temporary Liturgical Adaptations during the 2014 Flu/Cold Season

Once more, a particularly virulent strain of flu (H1N1) and other respiratory contagions are manifesting themselves throughout our nation and here at home, including a growing number of deaths in the county. H1N1 seems most adversely to attack children, healthy young people and pregnant women. Because of this, I have been approached by members of the medical community who have requested that we make a number of temporary adaptations to our celebrations of the Eucharist, so as to foster the health of our worshipping communities and also of the wider community.

For this reason, I find it necessary to implement the following steps wherever Mass is celebrated in the Diocese of San Jose:

1. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will not be shared under the form of Consecrated Wine. Concelebrating priests and assisting deacons are to receive the Precious Blood by means of intinction.
2. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will be distributed only into the hands of communicants; during this time, Holy Communion will not be distributed on the tongue.
3. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, people should not hold hands during the recitation or singing of the Lord's Prayer.
4. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, the Sign of Peace should be adapted so as to allow for a greeting that does not involve shaking hands or touching.
5. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, all who administer Holy Communion are to wash their hands with an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution, such as Purell, before and after they administer the Sacrament. This precaution also extends to those who minister to the homebound.
6. These adaptations are to remain in effect throughout the Diocese until conditions allow me to rescind them.

The Director of Public Health has assured me that these precautions are once again necessary so that we can do our part to foster the health and safety of our people. In conjunction with this, when you explain these adapted procedures to your people, please remind them that the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass does not hold for those who are seriously ill, and that it would be especially prudent for anyone who has fever, cough or other such symptoms to remain at home. Please refer to the article, "Liturgy, Cold, and the Flu: Common Sense Practices," which Diana Macalintal has recently circulated throughout the Diocese.

Thank you for your immediate attention to these matters and for undertaking the catechesis that will be necessary to introduce these adaptations to your parishes and other communities as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of January 18/19.

WHAT WAS THE THIRD ECUMENICAL COUNCIL?

- **Who called the Third Ecumenical Council?**
Theodosius' son Theodosius II influenced by his saintly sister Saint Pulcheria and, Pope Saint Celestine I called the third Ecumenical Council.
- **Where and when did this Council take place?**
This Council took place in the city of Ephesus, located in the southern tip of Asia Minor, in 431 AD, fifty years after the First Council of Constantinople.
- **Who were the protagonists at this Council?**
This council was led by Saint Cyril of Alexandria.
- **What was the most important outcome of this Council?**
 - ⇒ The Council defined that Christ has two natures - *Divine and human*, but only one Person who is Divine.
 - ⇒ This affirmation condemned *Nestorianism* and deposed Nestorius, who was the bishop of Constantinople.
 - ⇒ The Council also affirmed the Council of Carthage held for the local Church in 416, thus condemning Pelagius and his teachings.
