



FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Saturday (the 22nd) we will celebrate the feast of the Chair of St. Peter which has been celebrated in the Church perhaps as early as the 2nd century. This Feast commemorates Christ choosing Peter as his Vicar for the Church when He declared: *And I say to you: That you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. And I will give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. And whatsoever you shall bind upon earth, it shall be bound also in heaven: and whatsoever you shall loose on earth, it shall be loosed also in heaven* (Mt 16:13-20).

Historically, the Church at Rome celebrated on January 18th the day in which the Apostle held his first service with the faithful of the Eternal City. However, in its present form the *Martyrologium Hieronymianum* (Weissenburg manuscript) gives a second feast of the Chair of St. Peter for 22 February. "Both feasts are Roman; indeed, that of 22 February was originally the more important. This is clear from the Calendar of Philocalus drawn up in the year 354, and going back to the year 311; it makes no mention of the January feast but speaks thus of 22 February."

Therefore, the Church celebrated both the first and second assumption of St. Peter to the episcopal office in Rome. At the beginning the feast of the *Cathedra Petri* was celebrated on the Via Salaria on January 18th; in the Vatican Basilica it was observed on February 22nd. It is easy to believe that after the triumph of Christianity the festival could be celebrated with greater pomp in the magnificent basilica erected by Constantine the Great over the *confessio*, or grave of Peter, than in a chapel far distant from the city on the Via Salaria, and this is why today we celebrate this beautiful feast on February 22nd.

The Feast of the Chair of St. Peter reminds us that it is the see of Peter that unites us. It reminds us that our unity is the unity of all Catholic bishops in the world, as successors of the Apostles, with the Bishop of Rome as their servant-leader. "Where Peter is," the saying goes, "there is the Church."

"To celebrate the Chair of Peter, as we do today, means, therefore, to attribute to it a strong spiritual significance and to recognize in it a privileged sign of the love of God, good and eternal Shepherd, who wants to gather the whole of his Church and guide her along the way of salvation," says Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

It is important for us to see that this feast "sheds light on the special ministry of strengthening and guiding the Church in the unity of the faith which the Lord entrusted to the Head of the Apostles. It consists in this *ministerium petrinum* (Petrine ministry), the particular service that the Bishop of Rome is called to render to the entire Christian people. It is an indispensable mission that is not built on human prerogatives but on Christ himself, the cornerstone of the Ecclesial Community." (Bl. John Paul II)

Among the many testimonies of the Fathers of the Church that we could cite, I would like to quote a letter of St. Jerome to the Bishop of Rome which I find particularly interesting because of his explicit reference to the "chair" of Peter, presenting it as the safe harbor of truth and peace. Jerome writes thus: "I decided to consult the chair of Peter, where that faith is found exalted by the lips of an Apostle; I now come to ask for nourishment for my soul there, where once you received the garment of Christ. I follow no leader save Christ, so I enter into communion with your beatitude, that is, with the chair of Peter for this I know is the rock upon which the Church is built!" (*Le Lettere*, I, 15,1-2). It is with this spirit of faith that we should approach the celebration of this feast.

Dear brother and sisters, as sons and daughters of Mother Church, let us ponder in mind during this week the immeasurable grace of being Catholics. Let the motto of our life be, *cum petro et sub petro* –with Peter and under Peter (*Ad Gentes*, 38)– always united to the Vicar of Christ on earth, the Holy Father. Let us also remember Pope Francis' request when he was elected as Bishop of Rome: "pray for me" and keep him in our prayers. May God grant us the grace to be humble so that we might exercise the *obedience of faith* (Rom 1:5).

May God bless you always!

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind, "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are **168 HOURS** in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going **24/7**, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of **411 PEOPLE**.

*While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. **Don't be afraid** to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.*

Temporary Liturgical Adaptations during the 2014 Flu/Cold Season

Once more, a particularly virulent strain of flu (H1N1) and other respiratory contagions are manifesting themselves throughout our nation and here at home, including a growing number of deaths in the county. H1N1 seems most adversely to attack children, healthy young people and pregnant women. Because of this, I have been approached by members of the medical community who have requested that we make a number of temporary adaptations to our celebrations of the Eucharist, so as to foster the health of our worshipping communities and also of the wider community.

For this reason, I find it necessary to implement the following steps wherever Mass is celebrated in the Diocese of San Jose:

1. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will not be shared under the form of Consecrated Wine. Concelebrating priests and assisting deacons are to receive the Precious Blood by means of intinction.
2. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will be distributed only into the hands of communicants; during this time, Holy Communion will not be distributed on the tongue.
3. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, people should not hold hands during the recitation or singing of the Lord's Prayer.
4. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, the Sign of Peace should be adapted so as to allow for a greeting that does not involve shaking hands or touching.
5. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, all who administer Holy Communion are to wash their hands with an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution, such as Purell, before and after they administer the Sacrament. This precaution also extends to those who minister to the homebound.
6. These adaptations are to remain in effect throughout the Diocese until conditions allow me to rescind them.

The Director of Public Health has assured me that these precautions are once again necessary so that we can do our part to foster the health and safety of our people. In conjunction with this, when you explain these adapted procedures to your people, please remind them that the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass does not hold for those who are seriously ill, and that it would be especially prudent for anyone who has fever, cough or other such symptoms to remain at home. Please refer to the article, "*Liturgy, Cold, and the Flu: Common Sense Practices*," which Diana Macalintal has recently circulated throughout the Diocese.

Thank you for your immediate attention to these matters and for undertaking the catechesis that will be necessary to introduce these adaptations to your parishes and other communities as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of January 18/19.






