## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Yesterday at the Basilica of St. Peter in the Vatican, the Holy Father has enriched the College of Cardinals with 19 new members in the consistory celebrated on the Feast of the Chair of the Prince of the Apostles. Sixteen of the new cardinals will be eligible to vote in a future conclave to elect a new pope; three archbishops past voting age were also named cardinals in recognition of their years of service to the Church.

As we rejoice with the whole Church this occasion offers us a good opportunity to reflect about the nature of the sacred College of Cardinals whose members are called to participate on the lordship of Christ thinking and working in accordance with the logic of the Cross (cf. Benedict XVI). For this reason the crimson of the Cardinal's attire symbolizes the color of blood and a cardinal's willingness to die for his faith.

The code of Canon Law § 349 clearly states: "The Cardinals of the Holy Roman Church constitute a special College, whose prerogative it is to elect the Roman Pontiff in accordance with the norms of a special law. The Cardinals are also available to the Roman Pontiff, either acting collegially, when they are summoned together to deal with questions of major importance, or acting individually, that is, in the offices which they hold in assisting the Roman Pontiff especially in the daily care of the universal Church." Consequently, their mission is extremely important and entails a great responsibility.

The College of Cardinals is divided into three orders: the episcopal order, to which belong those Cardinals to whom the Roman Pontiff assigns the title of a suburbicarian Church, and eastern-rite Patriarchs who are made members of the College of Cardinals; the presbyteral order, and the diaconal order. Cardinal priests and Cardinal deacons are each assigned a title or a deaconry in Rome by the Roman Pontiff. The Cardinals, who oversee the presbyterates of 25 titular and *quasi parish* Churches of Rome are particular and closer advisers and collaborators of the Pope.

One of the main tasks of the College is to advise the Pope about Church matters when he summons them to an ordinary consistory. It also assembles on the death or resignation of a Pope as a papal conclave to elect a successor. But the College has no ruling power except during the *sede vacante* (papal vacancy) period, and even then its powers are extremely limited by the terms of the current law, which is laid down in the Apostolic Constitution *Universi Dominici Gregis* and the Fundamental Law of Vatican City State.

The College of Cardinals was formed in 1150, with a Cardinal Dean, who is the Bishop of Ostia and the *Camerlengo* who on the death of the Pontiff has the Administration of the affairs of the Holy See. Since 1059 the College is the exclusive elector of the Pope.

The Historical Notes in the "*Annuario Pontificio 2000*" bring very interesting facts that make us appreciate more the mission and importance of the College of Cardinals: It was not until the 12th century that Cardinals began to be named from those who were prelates in residence outside of Rome. -The number of Cardinals, in the 13<sup>th</sup> to the 15<sup>th</sup> centuries usually not over 30, was fixed by Sixtus V to 70: 6 Cardinal Bishops, 50 Cardinal priests, 14 Cardinal deacons. In the private Consistory of 1958, John XXIII departed from the number of Cardinals already established by Sixtus V and confirmed by the 1917 Code of Canon Law (Can. 231). Again John XXIII, with the Motu Proprio *Cum gravissima* (1962), established that henceforth all Cardinals were to be bishops. Paul VI, with the Motu Proprio *Ad Purpuratorum Patrum* (1965), determined the place of the Oriental Patriarch within the College of Cardinals. The same Roman Pontiff, with the Motu Proprio *Ingravescentem aetatem* (1970), established that when Cardinals reached the age of 80: a) they ceased to be members of the Dicasteries of the Roman Curia and of all the Permanent Organisms of the Holy See and of the Vatican City State; b) they become ineligible to elect the Roman Pontiff and to enter the Conclave. In the Secret Consistory of 1973 Paul VI established that the maximum number of Cardinals that have the right to elect the Roman Pontiff be set at 120. Bl. John Paul II, in the Apostolic Constitution *Universi Dominici gregis* (1996) reconfirms this directive.

Brothers and Sisters, may we always remember in our prayers the Princes of the Church in their challenging task of shepherding God's flock.

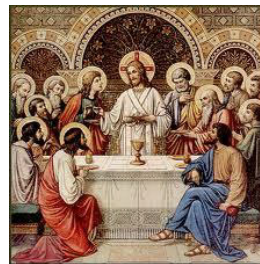

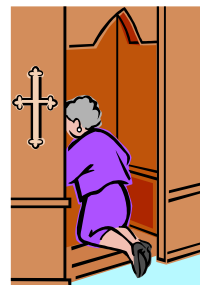

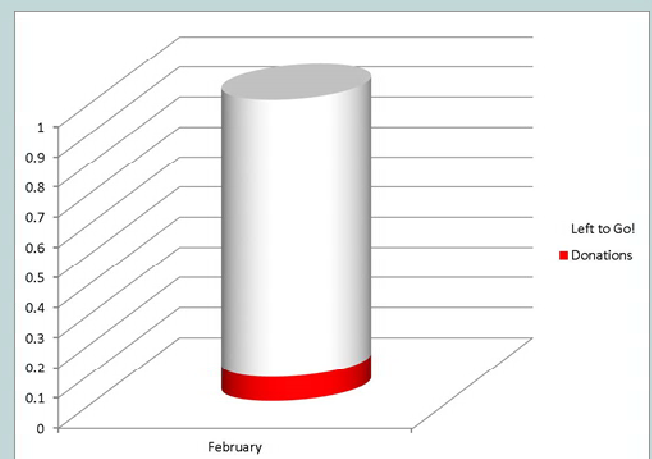

**What is Eucharistic Adoration?**

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind, "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt 28:20).

There are **168 HOURS** in a week. It takes about 336 people to keep adoration going **24/7**, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of **411 PEOPLE**.

*While perpetual adoration is forever, one's life changes over time. The Lord understands this, and so do we. **Don't be afraid** to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.*

**Temporary Liturgical Adaptations during the 2014 Flu/Cold Season**

Once more, a particularly virulent strain of flu (H1N1) and other respiratory contagions are manifesting themselves throughout our nation and here at home, including a growing number of deaths in the county. H1N1 seems most adversely to attack children, healthy young people and pregnant women. Because of this, I have been approached by members of the medical community who have requested that we make a number of temporary adaptations to our celebrations of the Eucharist, so as to foster the health of our worshipping communities and also of the wider community.

For this reason, I find it necessary to implement the following steps wherever Mass is celebrated in the Diocese of San Jose:

1. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will not be shared under the form of Consecrated Wine. Concelebrating priests and assisting deacons are to receive the Precious Blood by means of intinction.
2. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, Holy Communion will be distributed only into the hands of communicants; during this time, Holy Communion will not be distributed on the tongue.
3. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, people should not hold hands during the recitation or singing of the Lord's Prayer.
4. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, the Sign of Peace should be adapted so as to allow for a greeting that does not involve shaking hands or touching.
5. For the duration of the flu/cold/virus season, all who administer Holy Communion are to wash their hands with an alcohol-based anti-bacterial solution, such as Purell, before and after they administer the Sacrament. This precaution also extends to those who minister to the homebound.
6. These adaptations are to remain in effect throughout the Diocese until conditions allow me to rescind them.

The Director of Public Health has assured me that these precautions are once again necessary so that we can do our part to foster the health and safety of our people. In conjunction with this, when you explain these adapted procedures to your people, please remind them that the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass does not hold for those who are seriously ill, and that it would be especially prudent for anyone who has fever, cough or other such symptoms to remain at home. Please refer to the article, "Liturgy, Cold, and the Flu: Common Sense Practices," which Diana Macalintal has recently circulated throughout the Diocese.

Thank you for your immediate attention to these matters and for undertaking the catechesis that will be necessary to introduce these adaptations to your parishes and other communities as soon as possible, but no later than the weekend of January 18/19.

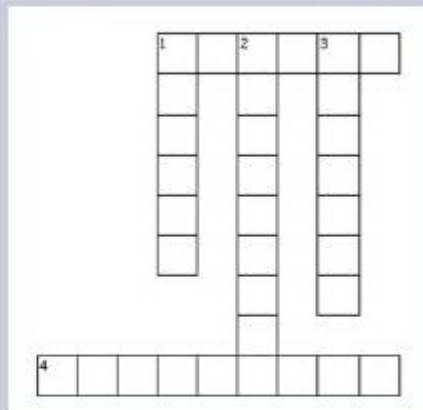
